

To mobilize Bolivian churches in La Paz to plant Gospel-Our vision: focused, disciple-making, missional churches that glorify God in their city, country, and world (Acts 1:8).

This vision continues to capture our hearts and guide our daily footsteps in Bolivia. These footsteps have led us on a journey where we have marvelled at who God is and what He does. We will share in more detail over this home assignment some of the ways we have seen God at work. However, we would like to dedicate this first furlough update as a "Family Edition". In different ways, so many of you have joined our family on this journey. And, we are grateful beyond what words can express for your partnership, friendship, prayers and support.



Every Christian a "Little Christ"

I (Greg) meditate through Christ's life every other year by reading a gospel harmony, a book that places the events of Christ's life in chronological order. Recently, I found myself scribbling new notes in the margins of my old harmony, as if I were the first person to discover certain insights about Christ.

The gospel harmony tells the story of the life and work of Christ, who glorified His Father as He carried out a mission (Jn 17:4): To make disciples who will glorify God in their city, country, and world (Mt 28:18-20; Acts 1:8). Christ invested in a few to reach the many. When Christ sends out his twelve disciples on a short-term mission trip, they return to give Him a report of what they had done (Lk 9:10).

Then Christ sends out 72 disciples in pairs, and they return with joy to give Him another report of God's marvelous work (Lk 10:17). After Christ's ascension, the

church is born, and Christ's followers were first called "Christians" at Antioch (Acts 11:26). Christ's early followers were becoming like Christ and were seen as "little Christs." This young church in Antioch sends out Paul and Barnabus as "little Christs", and they return from their missionary journeys to give a report, this time to the body of Christ, the church (Acts 14:26-27). In the same way, Faith and I return from Bolivia every 3 or 4 years to give a report to you in person of what God has done by His grace.
