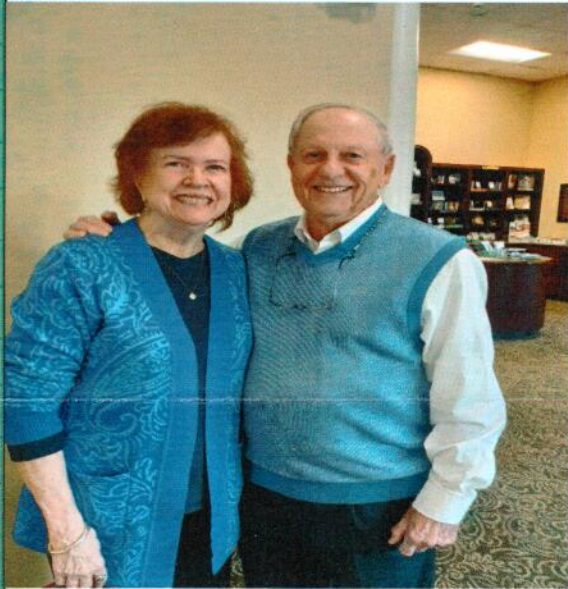


# THE KANOUR NEWS LETTER

Dear extended family,

On May 5, 2026 Lelah was weeding our garden and tripped over a sewer pipe that she forgot was there. She ended up falling and the impact of the fall resulted in a broken hip and a fractured femur. We are praising God that the operation to repair her broken hip was successful. After her surgery she was admitted to the Peak Rehabilitation Hospital for 14 days. Her recovery is progressing well and she is in good spirits despite occasional severe bouts with pain. We are seeing good progress in her recovery as she undergoes her physical therapy here at home.
