Last words...

Writing about the Great Commission in his very first prayer letter, Dr. Lareau Lindquist, the founder of Barnabas International, wrote these words: "We cannot do everything, but we must do something."



Looking back at our 43 years of global ministry, we echo that statement. Following the "path laid out for us" we have taken one obedient step at a time to do what God asked us to do and sought to become what He called us to become. In the whole scheme of God's Kingdom work in the world over time and place, our part has been tiny. At the same time, we declare that God has done so much more than we could ever have imagined or asked. And we are exceedingly grateful to Him and to you for being on this journey with us. We believe and know it has been a partnership with God, you and us for the sake of His Kingdom and His glory. Won't it be a magnificent day when all the details of the story are revealed?

The Apostle Paul closed his very personal letter, II Timothy, to his beloved son in the faith, Timothy, with these words: "I have fought the good fight, I have

finished the race, I have kept the faith." Similarly, we also want to close our last ministry letter to you with some personal reflections.

God at Work: Reflections



A Purpose runs through It.

One of the first questions we ask ourselves as we reflect back on our missionary service is **Why**? Why did God call two young and very inexperienced kids, who knew so very little about the world and had

lived, frankly, a very sheltered life in America, why did God call us into cross cultural missionary service? OK, truthfully, that question might never be answered. God seldom explains the why. What we can know is that God's **purposes** ran through it all. Romans 8:28-30 reads:

"We know that in all things. God works for good for those who love him, who have been called according to His purpose. For those God foreknew He also predestined to be conformed to the likeness of His Son, and those He predestined he also called. Those he called he also gives."

The reason we originally thought we were called to the mission field, to train national church leaders and pastors behind, what was then called, the Iron Curtain turned out to be only the first part of God's call for us--the first act. Leadership roles, women's ministry, member care and pastoral care developed over the subsequent years. As Debbie has always often said, our vision was only an inch high but God's had purposes beyond our imagining. There is no power in heaven or earth that can prevent God's purposes from coming to fruition. Purpose runs through all our lives and it is called the Sovereignty of God. We can trust God for His purposes in our lives.

The Surpassing Power of God

Il Corinthians 4:5-7 reads:

"We do not preach ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus's sake. But we have this treasure and jars of clay to show that all that this all surpassing power is from God and not from us."

To try to understand God's purposes in one's life is much harder and more uncomfortable when your gaze is upon yourself. For then your awareness of

personal sin, failure, and inadequacies becomes acute. But these verses remind us that the **Power** of God does not rest in "these jars of clay", but in God Himself. We attest today that through these many years we have seen God's power through His Word and His Spirit in all the over 60 countries we have ministered in. It has never been by our might nor our power, but by His Spirit (Zecharaiah 4:6) that God's love has been lived out through us. It is all about God. God is real and God is good. We so identify with Henri Nouwen's description of a "wounded healer". Though we are broken jars of clay, we are still somehow usuable to God because His power is all-surpassing, sustaining, and overcoming. There is no power on earth or in heaven that can match God's supreme power to accomplish His will. Power runs through our lives and it is called the Holy Spirit. We can trust God for His power to overcome our inadequacies.

The People of God kept us Running

We openly acknowledge that we could not have come this far without **People!** Our communities have been used by God to keep us going on. Hebrews 12:1-3:

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles us, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us.Let us fix our eyes upon Jesus, the Author and Perfector of our faith, for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinful men, so that you will not grow weary and not lose heart."

The great cloud of witnesses that surround us all call us to run strong, with perseverance, so we do not lose heart and fail to complete our race. Today we can say that without the people of God, both those like you who sent us, financed, and prayed for us, and for those who received, taught, encouraged and ministered with us, we could not have gotten to this finish line. We never ran alone. In Romans 16, Paul lists 24 names of people he wants to thank as he moves into his last stage of ministry. These are not just names and lists. They are real people who helped him in real ways.






