I came up with 5 conversation questions for Christmas – I've "stress-tested" them over the last week and want to pass them on to you in case you might like to use them too!

FIVE FUN CHRISTMAS CONVERSATION QUESTIONS:

1 - What do you think it is about Christmas that can bring out a feeling of wonder?

- 2 If you could give one non-material gift to everyone, what would it be?
- 3 Has a Christmas experience ever shaped or changed your life in a new or special way?
- 4 What keeps you grounded and gives you peace during the busy holiday season?
- 5 What Christmas traditions mean the most to you?

PRAISE:

- ~ Clark's blood tests have remained stable; he's had more energy and has regained some of his appetite! We are beginning to make plans to travel to Berlin.
- ~ Our neighbors seemed to really enjoy my little Thanksgiving coffee on First Advent. I gave them a story about the Native American, Squanto, that shared how he discovered God's love in Christ.
